AMAZON ROBUSTA COFFEE

Within the canephora species coffee, there are several varieties, such as conilon and robusta. Embrapa Rondônia conducted studies to develop a variety adapted to the characteristics of the region, which are very similar to those of the Amazon. They

created a hybrid variety between conilon and robusta, combining their best characteristics and resulting in the so-called Amazonian Robustas. We have approximately 30 hectares of planted coffee, with a high harvest estimate. Developed especially for the Amazon region, Amazonian Robustas are clonal varieties. Because of that, our vegetative propagation is done by the cutting method, which is easier and faster, unlike Arabica, which is propagated by seeds.


The production of Amazonian Robustas coffee in the Amazon began to gain space and importance, and we were the first to invest and believe in the potential of coffee in our municipality. Today, we participate and provide training to small, medium and large producers who want to invest in coffee growing. The coffee marketed initially originated outside the state, because the coffee produced in Amazonian soil was considered of low quality, and the plants were not very productive, characterized by extractive agricultural activity and poor efficiency in land use. The evolution in coffee production in the Amazon can be exemplified by the data we collect today from numerous families reached by this culture. We have a nursery with certified and standardized seedlings.

DETAILS ON PRODUCTION CAPACITY, SEASONALITY AND OTHER CHARACTERISTICS:



Currently our production capacity is variable because we depend on our climate, fertilization and other factors. However, we are getting an average of more than 80 bags per hectare.

Today, we are a reference team in our state and municipality. We fight hard for our history, seeking to grow every day with responsibility and commitment. We are nothing without our team; behind Fazenda Progresso, there is a family that has achieved everything with a lot of struggle and persistence.
